

Information and Instructions – Scholarships 2022

Eligibility

Applicant must be graduating in the spring of the year of application and be a resident of District 158. Individuals who live in the boundaries of the Huntley school district but attend another school are eligible.

Scholarships are for college costs related to enrollment in an accredited two or four-year degree program.

Rotary Club of Huntley proposes four types of scholarships, and each type will in have one or more awards:

- RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) one at \$350
- Academic (four-year university) several awards totaling \$1,500
- Vocational (one- or two-year community school) one or more awards totaling \$500
- Thomas Palmer one \$500 award for student enrolling in courses for Parks & Recreation

Selection Criteria

Primary – Participation in Service Activities

Rotary International encourages vocational, community and international service and has the motto: *Service Above Self.* The Rotary Club of Huntley appreciates youth who serve others.

<u>Secondary</u> – (not necessarily listed in order of importance) Academic Achievement Financial Need Personal Statement School and non-school extra-curricular activities Presentation of application either handwritten or generated electronically, is to be neat and legible.

Application selections will be based on the judgement of the Rotary Club of Huntley.

A Resume may be attached if it includes or replaces requested information.

Application Forms

Forms will be available at the Huntley High School guidance office and should include this checklist:

- Application form
- Information and Instruction sheet
- Essay/Personal Statement please limit document to one or two pages
- Activity sheet Community and School Service participation list for time during high school, including the number of hours and the school year(s) service activity occurred.
- Letter of recommendation signed
- Transcript
